
# LEVEL 2 DIPLOMA IN WORK-BASED FENCING

### Expectations at level 2

Achievement reflects ability to select and use relevant knowledge, ideas, skills and procedures to complete well-defined tasks and address straightforward problems. It includes taking responsibility for completing tasks and procedures and exercising autonomy and judgement subject to overall direction or guidance.

#### Introduction

This qualification is a competencybased qualification and is based on the Fencing National Occupational Standards. This qualification is aimed at those who are involved in a variety of fencing roles (general fencing and vehicle restraint systems) and is suitable for those who are working in a technical role or supervisory/management level.

### Structure

This qualification has six mandatory units and six optional units which are divided into two pathways, general fencing and vehicle restraint systems. To achieve the Level 2 Diploma in Fencing, the learner will need to achieve six mandatory units and a minimum of three optional units.
